Congratulations to Enda Doherty, one of our parishioners, who raised €60,000 for Pieta House in his walk from Belfast to Waterford. This was a very courageous and daunting endeavour by Enda who completed a marathon walk of 26 miles per day over 9 days carrying a washing machine on his back. He had to endure serious discomfort on the very arduous adventure, including severely blistered feet, extreme fatigue and pushing himself to the very limit of physical, spiritual and emotional boundaries.

At one stage, virtually exhausted and beginning to hallucinate, he was tempted to succumb and bow out of the great adventure. But heartrending stories communicated to him of those who survived suicide attempts pushed him to extreme limits of endurance. He has succeeded in drawing attention to the horrendous tragedy of suicide in our community and has contributed enormously to the possibility of ensuring that the Pieta House project in Waterford will be completed.

Heartiest congratulations again and all parishioners are very proud of his great achievement.
