Gospel Reflection for the Sixth Sunday of Easter **Peace and Love**

Our world is complex and demanding. The daily pressures on us all are immense, and that is when stress can take over and affect us in all sorts of negative ways. Stress can make us perform less well, it can make us difficult to live with, it can even make us ill.

Finding peace can just seem like a bit of a naïve idea. We think we might find peace if we finish that mountain of work or sort out a money problem, but somehow there is always another problem just around the corner and peace eludes us yet again. Could it be that we are looking for peace in the wrong places?

In today's gospel reading, Jesus bids farewell to his friends and gives them some parting promises. One of his promises is that he will leave us his peace, but it will not be a peace found of this world. We will not find Jesus' peace in being marooned on a desert island, in the freedom of a bank holiday Monday or in a pension plan. We will not even find peace in the absence of hostility conflict or war. We will only find peace by living in God's love, and living in God's love means sharing his mission. Jesus' peace is found in integrity and justice and wholeness. Peace is found when we stop thinking about ourselves and think about others.

In Jesus' farewell it is easy to sense the abandonment the disciples must have felt; easy, because there are times when we too feel alone and abandoned. There will almost definitely be times when the inner peace we thought we'd found isn't enough! There'll almost definitely be times when we are afraid and our friends and family seem ill equipped to help us. Jesus reminds us that in times such as these we have the Holy Spirit ever present and dwelling within us to give us strength, comfort and guidance.

In these weeks before Pentecost we celebrate that while life is dishing out its unfair share of relentless challenges, the Spirit is always there to encourage and remind us.

Edmund Rice Week of Prayer 2016 (May 3^{rd} , 4^{th} , 5^{th} and 6^{th}) All events start at 8.00 pm.

Opening night, Tuesday May 3rd: Mass celebrated by Fr. Robert Grant PP. Ballybeg – a past pupil of Waterpark College. The guest speaker will be Ms. Monica Reilly. She has been deeply involved in Brothers' projects in deprived areas of Dublin. She will speak about Edmund Rice's influence on her life and ministry. The choir on Tuesday will be the Cathedral Vigil choir led by Caroline Reid-O'Brien.

On Wednesday 4th May the Edmund Rice Camp Leaders based here in Mount Sion will lead a Retreat session. Three of them went to India last summer. They will recount their experiences there and the impression it made on them

On Thursday May 5th (The Feast of Blessed Edmund) Mass will be celebrated by Fr. Patrick Duffy . Fr. Duffy, who is from Dublin, spent some of his early adult life here in Mount Sion as a Christian Brother teaching in the Manor CBS. He left the Brothers before Final Profession, later married, and became a father, later a grand-father. When his wife died he became a priest in Ferns.

The guest speaker on this evening is Dr Donal Blake, a Christian Brother based in Dublin. He too spent some time in Mount Sion. The Edmund Rice Choral and Musical Society will sing at this Mass.

Friday May 6th, is a first Friday and we will have our usual Taizé Prayer evening with the Island of Ireland Peace Choir. They will be joined by some members of the High Hopes Choir who will give us an insight into the realities of Homelessness.
