## Gospel Reflection for the Eleventh Sunday of Ordinary Time He Who Has Been Forgiven Little Loves Little.

There are none so unforgiving as those who have never committed any great sin of their own .... who have never had their comfortable standards put to the test .... who have never sought forgiveness with any great need. Perhaps for these people it doesn't seem any big deal to withhold forgiveness because they have never experienced the joy and relief of receiving it.

It's a very different story for those who know the burden of guilt, for those who wish they could put the clock back and undo the sins that colour their future. For these people, forgiveness is liberation and salvation.

This is how the woman of ill repute must have felt in today's gospel. She had the burden of sin taken away from her and she was overwhelmed with gratitude and love for Jesus. "He who has been forgiven little loves little," Jesus tells us. To know the importance of forgiveness in our own lives is to know the importance of forgiveness for others too.

Nowadays we are very quick to label people and judge them. Every time we open a newspaper or switch on our television we find ourselves automatically judging the politician who has had an affair, or the football hooligan who has trashed a city bar. But to have an unforgiving nature is to deny someone the chance to change. To deny someone forgiveness is to label them by their sin and fail to see anything worthy in them.

The Pharisees were careful to segregate themselves from sinners lest they became unclean. They saw their uninvited female guest as nothing more than a sinner, and they were appalled that Jesus did not see her in the same way. Jesus on the other hand saw her as someone with faith and a genuine desire to live her life in a different way. The invitation for us today is that we see people not by their past misdemeanours, but by their true worth. We are invited to share in the love and freedom that forgiveness can bring.

#### gExcerpt from Apostolic Exhortation: Amoris Laetitia: On Love in the Family, by Pope Francis.

Longer life spans now mean that close and exclusive relationships must last for four, five or even six decades; consequently, the initial decision has to be frequently renewed. While one of the spouses may no longer experience an intense sexual desire for the other, he or she may still experience the pleasure of mutual belonging and the knowledge that neither of them is alone but has a 'partner" with whom everything in life is shared. He or she is a companion on life's journey, one with whom to face life's difficulties and enjoy its pleasures. This satisfaction is part of the affection proper to conjugal love. There is no guarantee that we will feel the same way all through life. Yet if a couple can come up with a shared and lasting life project, they can love one another and live as one until death do them part, enjoying an enriching intimacy. The love they pledge is greater than any emotion, feeling or state of mind, although it may include all of these. It is a deeper love, a lifelong decision of the heart. Even amid unresolved conflicts and confused emotional situations, they daily reaffirm their decision to love, to belong to one another, to share their lives and to continue loving and forgiving. Each progresses along the path of personal growth and development. On this journey, love rejoices at every step and in every new stage.
