## **Carrying the Baton**

Over the years the Catholic Church has laid itself bare to criticism. Sometimes this criticism is underserved, but sadly at other times it is. At certain times in history the Church has been guilty of making mistakes, and doubtless it will continue to make mistakes in the future because we are all human. There

are those who complain that the Church is out of step with an increasingly secular world. There are even those who point to diminishing Mass attendances and predict that the Church is living on borrowed time. The bottom line however is drawn in today's gospel. Jesus turns to Peter and says, "You are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my Church." Whether Jesus' idea of 'Church' is our idea of 'Church' is debateable, but one thing is for sure, Jesus intended to leave behind a group of followers initially led by Peter, united in their belief of Jesus and God until the end of time.

Because Peter recognised that God was acting through Jesus, he was entrusted with the job of leading the rest of us. The Church today is a testimony to Peter's faith, it exists because Peter and others like him trusted and believed in God. It exists because Peter and people like Peter acted out their faith despite hostilities and persecution. Fortunately today's Christians don't get chucked to the lions any more, but we face different sorts of problems instead. Today we face lethargy, conflicting secular values, and the complexities of scientific debate. The Church cannot be silenced. Fearless Christians like Peter and Paul are still needed to carry the baton.

The Sand Dam Project is part of our Parish Partnership with

Ishiara, Kenya,

At the moment, 90% of people in Ishiara have no running water. The best way of providing water in a sustainable way is by means of sand dams. They are relatively low cost constructions that are then managed and maintained by the local

community.

These dams will provide drinking water, the means to grow crops, cause a reduction in the number of mosquitoes ( thereby curtailing water-borne diseases), and will allow the growth of crops and vegetation.

Total cost of project: €25,000. Amount raised to date: €10,000.

#### **GDPR** and Parish Records

What is GDPR? The General Data Protection Regulation is European legislation governing personal data which came into effect on 25th May 2018. The following are among the changes being implemented in the parish:

- As a result of GDPR, no personal data held in parish records will be visible or accessible to the general public.
- All requests for issuing of certificates ( eg: Baptismal records, etc ), must be on an official application form and accompanied by photo I.D.
- Only Office Staff will have access to parish
- computers. All are now password controlled.
   Office doors will be closed to the public outside of normal office opening hours.
