Gospel Reading, Luke 10:38-42

Jesus visits the house of Martha and Mary.



Balance between Doing and Listening is crucial to our spirituality. So surely Jesus is not criticising Martha for 'doing'. So what on earth is going on here? The key to this passage is Jesus' comment to Martha: "Mary has chosen the better part, which will not be taken away from her". A seemingly innocuous comment - and the traditional interpretation is that Jesus is somehow scolding Martha for

choosing wrongly. Perhaps Jesus has a twinkle in his eye at this point and he's making a gentle joke to help Martha understand what's really happening in her front room! Martha has been out in the kitchen. She's making the food and dishing up the dinner for 13 unexpected guests, and Jesus says to her, "Mary has chosen the better But actually, that isn't exactly what he says. If we go back to part..." the Greek, what Jesus actually says is this: "Mary has chosen the better portion..." And the word 'portion' is the same word that is used for a portion of food. What Jesus is saying is this: "Martha, you are out in the kitchen worrying about portions of food. But the portion of food Mary is digesting in here is much more important!" He's not scolding Martha. He's not saying that she is making the wrong choice by being busy. Instead, Jesus is comparing the relative value of bread for the stomach with bread for the soul! "I am the bread of life. He who comes to me will never go hungry".
