Gospel Reflection for the Nineteenth Sunday of Ordinary Time
The Everlasting Purse



St. Joseph & St. Benildus

There are no two ways about it; human beings are materialistic by nature. Our possessions become a part of us. Anyone who has tried to declutter the attic only to find possessions they can't possibly be parted from will be only too aware of this. Worse than that, our possessions start to possess us. We are trapped in jobs we hate simply because we are committed to buying that dream house. Suddenly our possessions are dictating how we live our lives. Then when we die, somebody will

come along and give everything we owned to a charity shop, because at the end of the day, our possessions mean very little.

Today we are told, "Sell your possessions, and give alms. Make purses for yourselves that do not wear out, an unfailing treasure in heaven, where no thief comes near and no moth destroys. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." Salvation is determined by what we do with what we have, and how much love we have in our hearts for others.

How much we help others of course depends very much on what we have in the first place. "To who much is given much is required." Jesus tells us. If we have talents, a well -paid job and the good fortune to be born into an affluent society, we are expected to help those who have never had the opportunity to develop their talents or who own very little. 
Holy Day: August 15th Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

Vigil Mass: St Joseph & Benildus: 6.30p.m on 14th St. Mary's, 7.00p.m on 14th. Feast Day Mass: 11.00a.m in both churches.

Tuesday August 13th is the Feast of St. Benildus, one of our parish patron saints. He was born Pierre Romancon on June 14, 1805, in France. He joined the

Brothers in 1820 and served at several Brothers' schools in south-central France. He worked quietly and effectively as teacher and principal. He also looked after his students by preparing meals in the Brothers' kitchen for hungry students.

His extraordinary religious sense was evident to everyone: at Mass with the students in the parish church, teaching catechism, preparing boys for first communion, visiting and praying with the sick, and rumours of



Benildus was beatified on April 4, 1948, by Pope Pius XII who mentioned that his sanctification was attained by enduring "the terrible daily grind" and by "doing common things in an uncommon way". He was canonized by Pope Paul VI on October 29, 1967. He is a patron of teachers.



Eight Lasallian volunteers went to Keelamudiman in Southern India to construct a multi-purpose Hall for the local secondary school and parish. It was a one month project carrying tonnes of sand and tonnes of stone chips up one story every day.



We spent our time also mixing cement, filling pillars and taught in the school. Only 36-40 degrees heat daily. Overall, a brilliant experience and life changing for many. From the parish, Br Thomas and Tom Fallon were involved. Our sincere thanks to the parish for all their support and prayers.
