Gospel Reflection for the Fourth Sunday of Advent: Difficult Decisions.



If we are lucky we might get through life without making any painful or difficult decisions, but we can't all be so lucky. There are some who will choose to give birth to a child knowing that the baby has a disability. There are those who will choose to care for a relative who is very ill or dying. These decisions are made with no real clue of what lies ahead, but they will always be made out of love.

There's no doubt about if, for people who make difficult decisions in life there will be great difficulties ahead. What is equally certain is that there will be great rewards too.

Our Nativity scenes show Mary and Joseph smiling fondly at the Baby Jesus as though bringing the son of God into the world had been one of the easiest decisions to make. As we look in at the cosy scene, we have to remember that the history of salvation would have been completely different if either Mary or Joseph had said 'no' to God's plan. Saying 'yes' to Gods' plan didn't give Mary or Joseph an easy life, but being part of God's plan in such a direct and practical way must have brought them great fulfilment, and of course, it earned them a place in the history books for all eternity.

We too are part of God's plan, though it probably doesn't feel like it. We too have a part to play in leaving the world a better place than we found it. What is God asking of each of us? Advent is a time to make decisions that will turn our predictable lives into roller-coasters with difficult lows but rewarding highs.

Care for our Common Home : Choose a Live Tree

Although plastic Christmas trees are reusable from year to year, real trees are the more sustainable choice. Plastic trees are made of petroleum products (PVC), and use up resources in both the manufacture and shipping. Discarded artificial trees are then sent to landfills, where their plastic content makes them last forever. Live trees, on the other hand, are a renewable resource grown on tree farms, that are replanted regularly. They contribute to air quality while growing, and almost ninety percent are recycled into mulch.

Live trees also smell like Christmas!
